OBJECTIVES

General

Specific

2. To generate relevant knowledge in the intellectual and cultural realms of our social environment using the methods and traditions of philosophical thinking and the implementation of philosophical abilities
3. To lead research teams through interdisciplinary dialogue, critical reasoning, and tolerance of the different modes of human thinking to influence other fields of study related and unrelated to philosophy
4. To assess the philosophical topics and issues immersed in the situation of our present-day world, such as injustice, migratory flows, gender violence, poverty, discrimination of historically disadvantage groups, cultural pluralism, respect for the other, and the values of universalism

- Critical and dialogic attitude towards the different traditions and forms of philosophical thinking to integrate them in a socially committed interdisciplinary approach during the development of his or her research

- An extensive and critical knowledge of Philosophy, as well as a dialogic attitude allowing the comprehension of the different philosophical trends, today's philosophical issues and the progressive integration of his or her own well-grounded philosophical thinking
